# **FOREST STEWARD POSITION**

Forest Stewards lead restoration and community engagement activities at a park site, including: working alone and with family, neighbors, and fellow Forest Stewards, serving as the sole steward for a park or may work in teams, work at their own schedule. The duties of a Forest Steward varies seasonally but includes talking to community members about the work, removing weeds, planting native plants, and tending to newly planted plants.

#### **SUPPORT YOU RECIEVE**

- Access to regular educational workshops and other training opportunities
- All plants, tools, and materials necessary to engage community and do ecological restoration
- Technical assistance from program staff, including help with hosting events and guidance on restoration practices

#### WHAT WE ASK OF YOU

- Attend a 2-day orientation in fall 2021 and attend at least 1 educational workshop each year
- Serve as a Steward for at least 1 year
- Come with a willingness to learn skills to support community-based urban forestry
- Plan your restoration and engage your community with an anti-racist lens
- Maintain a positive working relationship with staff, volunteers, and community members, including following the Seattle Parks and Recreation Volunteer Code of Conduct
- Complete a background check
- Participate in a work planning meeting every 2 years with program staff
- Report on accomplishments
